



## Studying in Germany

Please go through the checklist for yourself and see if you meet all the requirements, could meet them, or identify what you still need. This checklist serves as a self-assessment and as an initial overview.

<b>Educational requirements</b>		<i>The educational requirements mentioned here are fundamental for studying in Germany. If these are not met, there is no chance of pursuing a degree in Germany.</i>
<b>Foreign school-leaving certificate with university entrance qualification</b> <hr/> <b>The transcript must demonstrate an overall grade of at least 50% of the maximum grade</b>	<input type="radio"/>	Higher Secondary (School) Certificate / Intermediate (Examination) Certificate (or substitute certificate.)

<b>Additional requirements</b>		
<b>You can cover your costs of living for the duration of your studies (blocked account with at least EUR 11,208 per year (as of 2023))</b>	<input type="radio"/>	Achievable requirement  <i>*Throughout your studies, you may work 120 full days or 240 half days, in addition to performing student jobs</i>
<b>Required German language skills (Depending on admission requirements)</b>	<input type="radio"/>	Language certificate at the required level (typically B1) available  <i>*Only if the study program requires a language proficiency level</i>
